



Corvette Memories of Greg and Sue Franklin by Susan T. Franklin PhD

Our love affair with Corvettes began with our first Corvette, a preowned 1981 silver and grey coupe soon followed by a beige and bronze 1986 Vette. At that time, two toned Corvettes were popular. Next, a friend sold us his red 1991 Corvette. In 2000, we bought our first NEW Corvette. From that day forward, only new Vettes for us.

We began involvement with the National Corvette Museum(NCM), in Bowling Green, Kentucky attending its ground breaking in 1992. An elderly Zora Arkus-Puntoff, Corrvette's Chief Engineer, was present at the control of a bulldozer wearing his racing helmet. We have a signed picture, "to Gregg and Sue" from Zora, of which we're very proud. We've met all other chief engineers. The second, Pave McClellan, sat on a bench with me on a muggy day in Bowling Green. When Greg returned after wandering around the show, Pave told Greg that I needed a red Corvette...I liked the idea. Later, Greg said he was "suckered" into agreeing with that plan.

Pave Hill, famous for always wearing plaid pants, was the third Chief Engineer. I sat next to his wife on a bus trip; we got on well as our common interests were Corvettes and quilting.
Tadge Juchter is the current Chief Engineer; you guessed it. We've met and also talked with him at one of the *Museum's*events.

Probably our most exciting memory is the *Museum* delivery of our 2008 Corvette. We flew to Nashville and then rented a car and drove to Bowling Green and stayed at a Hampton. At breakfast, we sat and watched our "baby" in the "nursery" via a video feed from the *Museum*. A driver from NCM picked us up and took us to the *Museum*. Our license was ZORAPRM and what struck us as strange is that few people understood what that meant!

Bob K. took the pictures we loaned him that were taken at the *Museum* commemorating our delivery experience and then framed them. We have Corvette treasures throughout our home and in our garage. These include engine covers, from Corvettes of both Greg and me that have signatures of the Corvette Racing team, executives, and engineers. My engine covers hang in my sewing room and Greg's in the garage. It's such fun to walk down memory lane! Join us if you'd like.
